GUIDE TO UNDERTAKING/USING AMERICAN BAPTIST HISTORY AND POLITY TUTORIAL

For candidates unable to participate in an onsite seminary level course related to American Baptist History and Polity, the following tutorial is offered as a substitute for meeting this requirement. This tutorial shall be undertaken with the guidance of an In Care Mentor, assigned in consultation with the candidate, by the Commission on the Ministry.

Believing these to be useful resources and references for persons serving in professional ministry, books noted in A, B, & C of the tutorial shall be purchased by the candidate. Maring & Hudson, and Goodwin's Hiscox Guide, also noted in section G, may be purchased or borrowed for the course of the tutorial.

The In Care Mentor and the candidate shall meet at least monthly for a minimum of 3 months to complete this tutorial. These meetings shall be for the purpose of reviewing material read in the intervening time. It is the responsibility of the In Care Mentor to assign particular texts as they are noted in the tutorial and to insure, insofar as possible, through conversation, that the assigned texts have been read and understood by the candidate.

Note that a brief paper (7-10 pages, see Section II) is required at the close of the tutorial. The paper should cover aspects of Baptist history, Baptist polity, and the uniqueness of the American Baptist denomination (especially in consideration of the candidate's former denominational affiliation). This paper shall be completed by the candidate and presented to the In Care mentor. It may be appropriate in some instances to share the paper with a subcommittee of the Commission on the Ministry.

At the conclusion of the tutorial, the In Care Mentor will write a brief note to the Commission stating that the candidate has effectively met and completed the requirements of the tutorial.

- 1. Candidate will gain an overview of the development of Baptist thought, with its origins in Europe and expansions to America.
- 2. Candidate understands and can express his/her faith story and call in light of Baptist history and distinctives.
- 3. Candidate has appreciation for the broad diversity within the denomination for gender, culture, ethnicity, and social issues.
- 4. Candidate is familiar with and can explain American Baptist organizational life and relationships nationally and regionally.
- 5. Candidate is familiar with ABC print resources available to congregations for study, teaching, and new member incorporation.
